# Multi-Bagger Stocks

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## **PROLOGUE**

The art of stock investing encompasses the subjective and often intuitive aspect of decision-making. It involves understanding market sentiment, interpreting company reports, and recognizing trends and patterns. It requires a keen sense of timing and judgment, as well as the ability to navigate the ebbs and flows of human emotions that shape the stock market. The following literature aims to simplify the concepts of identifying **Multi-bagger Stocks**.

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#### **How to Identify the right Stocks to buy?**

The objective is to filter out businesses that are growing at an extraordinary pace. The easiest way to implement this is to run the below set of queries or parameters on **SCREENER.IN** after every quarterly result season

Sales > 30 and Year-on-Year Quarterly Sales growth > 0 AND Year-on-Year Quarterly Profit growth > 60 AND Profit growth > 0 AND (Average return on capital employed 5 Years > 15 OR Average return on capital employed 10 Years > 15 OR Average return on capital employed 3 Years > 17 OR Return on capital employed > 10) AND Net profit > 0 AND Quarter-on-Quarter profits > 0 AND (Price to Cash Flow > 0 OR Price to Free Cash Flow > 0) AND Market Capitalization < 10000 AND Piotroski score > 6.5 AND

(Current price \* Volume) > 100000000

Once the query is run, you will get results as follows. You can make a watchlist of all the Stocks and choose from the desired Stock(s) from the list.

#### When to take entry in a Stock?

Determining the right time to enter a stock position is a critical aspect of successful investing or trading. While there is no one-size-fits-all answer, here are some key factors and strategies to consider when deciding when to take an entry in a stock.

Next step is to visit **CHARTINK.COM** and run the below screener/query on your watchlist and sort by **%change** after every quarterly result season.

Stock passes all of the below filters in watchlist segment:

Daily Close Greater than Daily Supertrend(15,3) 
Daily Volume Greater than Daily Sma(Daily Volume 7,20) * Number 
Daily Rsi(14) Greater than Number 60 
Daily Rsi(14) Greater than Number 60
```

The above set of query gives the ideal stocks which are favourable to take an entry position with. The query result will look like this:-

You can change the time period to "weekly" on the chart, in case you have a long term horizon. Once you get the list of stocks from the above screener, you can initially allocate 10% to top 10 stocks

#### **Risk Management**

Risk management in stock investing is the process of identifying, assessing, and mitigating potential risks associated with investing in stocks. Effectively managing these risks is crucial for protecting your capital and achieving your investment goals.

As a cardinal rule, **never risk more than 3% of your overall capital** in the cash market

In the below chart, we can see the risk is of around 13% so we can allocate 23% of the portfolio in the stock. 13% of 23% allocation is **2.99% risk on overall portfolio**.



Concentrated portfolios with proper risk management always produces extraordinary returns.

#### Position Sizing (How much to Buy/Sell?)

Position sizing is a critical aspect of risk management in investing. It refers to determining the quantity or size of a position (how many shares or contracts to buy or sell) in a particular investment or trade. Effective position sizing helps investors and traders manage risk, control potential losses, and optimize returns.

So based on the above risk management rule, you can ascertain the number of positions in the portfolio. Incase, this seems too complicated, you can assign equal weighted allocation across the 10 stocks selected by you.

Remember, the ideal no. of **positions in a portfolio can range be from 6 to 10** depending on your capital and liquidity in the stocks.

#### When to sell a Stock?

Deciding when to sell a stock is a crucial aspect of successful investing. The right time to sell can vary depending on your investment goals, risk tolerance, and the specific circumstances of the stock and the market.

However, we will make it simple and condition driven. Visit **CHARTINK.COM** and run the below screener/query on your watchlist and sell the stocks that appear in the results.

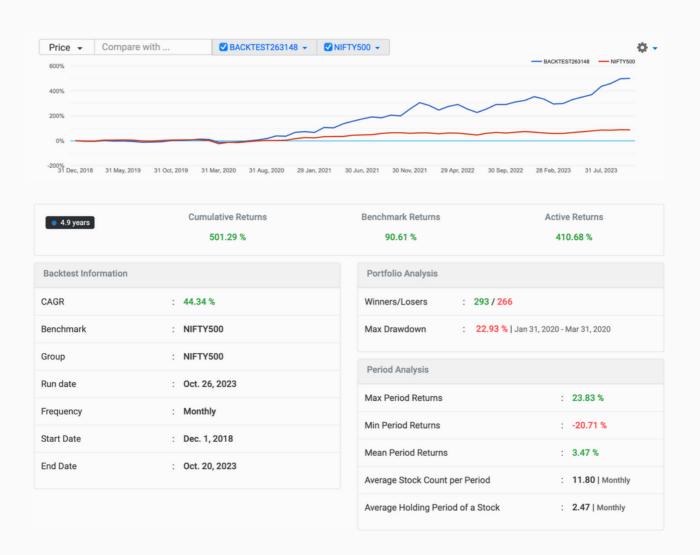
